Because of a waiver of fees the number of students seeking admission has increased this year. This clearly shows the socioeconomic status of people living around the college.
 - 3. **Opportunity**: The College can be a centre of learning in this rural set up if it can open new job oriented and skill based subjects without charging any extra fees on the students. If the funding for this can be arranged the problem of low enrolment and dropout rate can be checked.
