Generating Gender Consciousness and Elimination of Gender Disparity	A National Seminar on "Contemporary Gender Issues; Prospects and Challenges" was organised by Department of Economics, English and Education in collaboration with IQAC, H.C.D.G. College, Nitaipukhuri from 26th to 27th October 2021. It was an attempt at formulating gender transformative approaches which strive to examine, interrogate and change rigid gender norms and the imbalance of power, engage the various concepts like gender stereotypes, gender binaries, gender equity, gender empowerment etc. Dr. Nazim F. Akhter, Associate Professor, Department of English & I/C Centre for Women Studies, D U, Dr. Pranjal Pratim Buragohain, HoD, and Associate Professor, Department of Economics, D.U., Dr. Suryyakumar Chetia (HoD) in- charge, Mass Communication & Journalism, Assam Women University were resource persons. Seventy-five papers were presented in this seminar.
Development of Games and Sports	1. Tie-up programme with Nitaipukhuri Coaching Centre (N.P.C.C.) was organized on 24th March 2021 at Nitaipukhuri H.S. School playground to enhance sporting environment in Nitai- Panidehing area. It aims to increase training & practice of football and Volley Ball among the students of H.C.D.G. College. Almost 476 people, including student players of nearby schools and the college

were present in the programme. The college authority provided two nos. footballs to the coaching center. 2. The college signed a Memorandum of Understanding with Nitaipukhuri Coaching Centre (NPCC), Sivasagar on 05-01-2022 to enhance facilities and joint collaborative sporting activities between the college family and NPCC. The MoU creates a healthy sporting environment among the trainee players and can benefit the future generation of the area. The college authority provides eight pairs of shoes and socks to volleyball players (girls) of Nitaipukhuri Coaching center.

Imparting vocational education through Certificate Courses and Diploma Courses

1. IQAC organized seven day Certificate Course on 'Food Processing and Preservation' in collaboration with the State Government and Department of Agriculture, Sivasagar from 7th February to 13th February 2022. The experts theoretically and practically trained the participants on various topics such as food hygiene & food processing, processing of jam, jelly, chatni, processing of fruits & vegetables, preparing pickles, preparing Sauce, the process of preparing Cake, etc.

The program's objective is to teach participants how to enhance agricultural practices that will help to generate employment opportunities, resources, and technological advancements. 3. An Add on Certificate Course 'Diploma in Computer Application' was introduced on 4th March, 2022 by the College. This course is still going on. The main aim of the course is to provide the students with basic level of computer literacy.

Providing Traditional Indian Knowledge

1. A Gyaon-Bayon and Bhaona Exhibition Workshop was organized from 3rd March to 3rd April 2022, and drama was played on 11th April 2022. Ten participants participated in this Workshop. The main aim of this Workshop is to promote and preserve our Assamese Culture because Gyaon- Bayon, and Bhaona is the most popular element of Assamese Culture. 2. IQAC, H.C.D.G. College, from 21st March to 27th March 2022 organized a Sattriya Nritya workshop. The Workshop aimed to promote and preserve Indian classical music and dance form. Through this Workshop, participants understood the basic grammar of the Sattriya dance and the control of body parts. A total number of 18 participants participated in this Workshop. 3. An Yoga and Meditation Certificate course was introduced on 9th February 2022 by the Department of History & IQAC, H.C.D.G. College, in collaboration with Brahma Kumari Retreat Centre, Demow (Prajapati Brahma Kumaris Iswaris University). It is still going on. A total number of 50 students are enrolled in this course. The course is provided

for the physical and mental development of students. 3. Enactment of a short play (a Chotal Nat), 'Gharar Sadhu', scripted and directed by eminent play-wright-director Saponjyoti Thakur with his team Dergaon Natyachorcha Kendra on 4th December 2021. The play satirically reflects the busy life's effect on the family bond in modern-day society. 1. International Mother Language Language and Literature Day was organized by IQAC and the Department of Assamese of the college on 21st February 2022 to discuss and spread the importance of the mother language. 2. 15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

H.C.D.G. College is a single-stream college. The College offers only B.A. programme. The College offered flexible credit-based curricula in the Honours programme under the Choice Based Credit System of Dibrugarh University from 2019 onwards. Students of the fifth and sixth semesters are given a chance to choice Discipline specific courses. The students of 6th semester of B.A. Honours programme in Education and Assamese must submit a project report on community engagement. They surveyed on culture, lifestyle, socio-economic dimensions, indigenous education system, etc., of different communities in nearby villages and made reports. Environment education is compulsory for all students in the higher secondary first year and B.A. 2nd semester.

The draft guidelines for transforming higher education Institutions into multidisciplinary institutions prepared by University Grants Commission in 2022 proposed transforming higher educational institutions of the country into multidisciplinary degree-granting autonomous colleges. It recommended colleges to integrate professional and vocational education with the existing programmes. The colleges will collaborate with nearby institutions in clusters or become a university constituent as envisioned in NEP 2020.

In this context, the Assam government has set a target to implement the new National Education Policy by 2023. The Higher Education department has already informed the authorities of all colleges that higher secondary classes will not be in the colleges anymore. The state's universities have been preparing the draft revised Choice Based Credit System curriculum in place of the present curriculum for both the Undergraduate level and Postgraduate level as a holistic multidisciplinary programme for four years as per the guidelines for implementation strategies of Assam government Higher education department. Then, colleges will sign MoU with partner institutions, set timetables in consultation with partner colleges, upgrade academic facilities and infrastructures, display collaborative arrangements for offering study programmes, charge a tuition fee, make an institutional plan for multiple entry and exit and other.

H.C.D.G. College is situated to almost 10 km distance from nearby colleges. The College constituted a task cell with one Coordinator and three members to prepare a strategic plan to support and coordinate any issues relevant to implement the NEP 2020 in April 2022. The College is waiting for initiatives to be taken by government and Dibrugarh University. The College provided a few self-financing Add certificate courses to students. The Eco club of the College has been working for green initiatives within the campus. The college has Book bank facility for providing free books to the students belonging to the economically weaker section on a merit basis.

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

The institution is planning to implement for its students and teachers to take admission into online courses through online mode by resorting to National schemes like SWAYAM, MOOCs, NPTEL, etc., and is considering credits earned against elective and relevant courses. The institution is developing a system for executing ABC in a true sense, as per NEP

17.Skill development:

- H.C.D.G. College offers various skill development courses for the uplift of the skill of the student as well as the local community.
- 1. One day workshop on 'Knitting and Stitching' was organized on 4th January 2022 to train knitting and different types of stitching to students.
- 2. An Exhibition cum Sale Programme was organized on 11th January 2022.
- 3. Three Months Certificate Course on "Beauty Therapy Certificate Course" was conducted from 21st January to 21st May 2022. Fifteen students are enrolled in the course, of which 10 get certificates.

- 4. A six-month Diploma in Computer Application was conducted from March 2021 to August 2022. A total number of 27 students participated in the course.
- 4. A certificate course on Food Processing and Preservation was conducted by IQAC, H.C.D.G. College, from 7th February 2022 to 12th February 2022. In that course, 50 participants, both from the College and the local community and SHGs, participated.
- 5. The College also organized a workshop on Satriya Dance in collaboration with 'Nrityalaya' Demow from 21st March to 27th March 2022. Students from this College and other institutions participated in the program.

The institution plans to introduce various skills-based and value-based courses.

18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

The H.C.D.G. College has been organizing various programs to preserve, promote, and make aware of the Indian knowledge system among the students. Sattriya Nritya, an Indian Classical Dance form, is regularly taught. Folk literature and culture are focused through lectures, workshops, and performances. H.C.D.G. Campus Film Society attempts to promote and disseminate knowledge of Indian Culture by screening films and special lectures. Through the Weaving and Training Centre, the institution imparts knowledge of weaving, handloom, and handicrafts. Indian food, Indian dresses, music (Gayan-Bayan', Bhaona, sattriya dance), Chotal Nat, art, film screening programme, folklore? all these are emphasized. The institution imparts knowledge of Yoga and Meditation for the holistic development of the students. Moreover, the institution has established an Ethnic Museum to preserve ethnic culture. The college faculty has been engaging in the study and preservation of the culture of Deori community through documentation since April 2021. Different programmes on Film and Literature, Soft Skills, Modern Indian writing in English Translation, Language and Film, etc., were organized by the college to integrate Indian knowledge of language and culture. International Mother Language Day was organized each year on 21st February.

19. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE): Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

The outcome of learners in H.C.D.G. College is based on what the

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students will become competent in after completing bachelor's degree programmes. The teachers and learners are involved in attaining the objectives stated in the syllabus of each course of programmes prescribed by Dibrugarh University.

The students of the English college can communicate with fluency in the English language and be able to compose and analyse English prose, poetry, drama, script, etc. The subject enhances knowledge of English grammar among students. Students can translate and practice English in the Assamese language. The students of Assamese can compose, critically analyse and synthesize linguistics of prose, poetry, drama, and script in the Assamese language. Students can identify the contents of Assamese grammar, lexicon, idiomatic usage, translation, and practice. They can compare the culture and literature of different social backgrounds.

Economics, being one of the most multidisciplinary subjects of Arts and humanities, the learners can understand and analyse different day-to-day activities like the functioning of the market system, evaluating the economic system, price mechanism, and inflationary pressures, operations of the stock market and foreign direct mechanisms, so on. It develops logical reasoning and Mathematical aptitudes among the learners and inculcates the expertise of collection, organization, representation, and analyse of the data in a precise and decisive way. After completion of the B.A. programme in Education, students can develop teaching aptitude for the teaching profession. The subject empowers students to choose the right moral, social, and aesthetic values. The students can identify educational problems and prepare a hypothetical budget. The students can compute, organize and analyse collected data from field surveys in schools and society and graphically represent the statistical data.

The students of History can understand how the events of the past made things the way they are today. The students can better understand the people and societies of a particular period. They can also understand the change in our society and prepare themselves for their future. The students of Political Science are capable of making aware of the spirit of democratic values, critical outlook of the history of national and social movements, citizenship, legal, civics and administration for the country, and so on.

Therefore, after successful completion of the Bachelor programme, the learners will have the ability to face most of the competitive examinations in a service areas such as civil service, banking, teaching, clerical jobs, etc.

The institution plan to organize various programmes for the enhancement of the practical skill of students beyond existing instructional activities, such as training programme and workshop on teaching, data collection and organization, project writing, spoken English, preparation for competitive examination, a mock test of fill up MCQ answer script, field tour, debate on issues and challenges, report writing on a relevant topic of curricula etc. So, if the financial status of the institution permits, the use of different statistical packages, such as SPSS, STATA, SFA, DEAP, etc., would be initiated for the learners.

20.Distance education/online education:

Hem Chandra Dev Goswami College introduced the distance mode of education under Krishna Kanta Handique State Open University in 2012. Under this system, B.A. honors in Assamese courses are offered. Mr. Bitul Saikia is the Coordinator of this course. So far as blended learning is concerned, from the Covid-19 lockdown period, all teachers of the institutions have been applying different online learning platforms to disseminate knowledge among the students and organized various academic activities for the students. The institution plans to organize an awareness programme about distance education among students from neighboring villages. The college also aims at extending various Teaching learning processes through digital platforms such as uploading audio-visual lectures, introducing students to the recent trend of distance education like SWAYAM, exchanging idea and opinion with students and faculty members from other educational institutions through online modes, etc. Economically poor students can avail such cost-effective distance mode of education. The institution also aims to make students aware of vocational courses of distance education to implement NEP in the institution shortly.

CURRICULAR ASPECTS

1.1 - Curricular Planning and Implementation

1.1.1 - The Institution ensures effective curriculum delivery through a well planned and documented process

Hem Chandra Dev Goswami College, Nitaipukhuri ensures effective curriculum delivery through a well-planned and documented process. The college's academic calendar is prepared based on the academic calendar provided by Dibrugarh University in advance of the commencement of semester classes. The college academic calendar includes weekly working days, holidays, activities, and events to be organised by each department and cell, dates of the sessional test, notification dates of examination results, and admission notices. It is circulated to all the staff after approval of the principal in the form of hardcopy.

The college timetable is prepared by the Academic committee comprising the Vice-Principal and the heads of all departments. It is displayed on the notice board before starting the class after being approved by the principal. Each class is allotted for one hour duration. The classes are allocated as per credit of courses, and Heads of each department allot the classes and the portions of

the courses to be taught among teachers. Teachers keep their class time, contents, mentoring, and essential activities daily in their teaching plan.

Academic monitoring is handed over to the Vice-principal appointed by the Principal, who monitors the day-to-day conduct of classes as per the timetable.

1.1.2 - The institution adheres to the academic calendar including for the conduct of Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE)

The College adheres to the institutional academic calendar for conducting a continuous internal evaluation for each semester following the academic calendar of Dibrugarh University. The continuous internal evaluation process is based on two Sessional tests, preparation and presentation of the seminar using Power Point, Group Discussion, Home assignment, and percentage of daily attendance of the students per semester. Students are also engaged in field surveys, projects, tour programme, laboratory practicals, class tests, mock tests, and writing reports for experiential and participatory learning. The dates of all the sessional activities are included in the institutional academic calendar.

The examination schedule of the sessional test is displayed ten days in advance on the college notice board. Two sessional tests of 20 marks are in place of were conducted in each course for one hour duration. The question papers for the internal evaluation test are prepared by concerned faculties and approved by the department head. The answer scripts are evaluated, and marks obtained by students are displayed on the notice board of departments. Answer scripts are shown to students for counseling. Teachers discuss with students and provide needful instruction in one day as Mid Semester Feedback Assessment for better progress.

To enhance student learning experiences, various student-centric methods are executed. Seminars, Group Discussions, Project work, and various departments carry Field works out in the institution. The Department of Education provides practical courses on teaching techniques and Laboratory Practical. Language Lab is used to teach Spoken English. The students are aware of the internal examination process at the beginning of the academic session. Sessional examinations are conducted following the academic calendar of the college, which is prepared as per affiliating university guidelines, Dibrugarh University. Internal assessment marks are comprised of 3 units: viz- sessional examination, attendance of the class and submission of home assignment, seminar presentation, group discussion, and report writing. According to the Academic Calendar of the institution, sessional examinations, students' seminars, group discussions, report writing, and home assignments dated are informed to the students. The academic committee supervises the academic calendar, prospectus, class routine, etc. Disciplined atmosphere in a college is maintained by committees like Grievance and Redressal Cell, Anti-Raging Committee, Sexual Harassment Committee, Disciplinary Action Committee, Women Cell etc. There are Purchasing Committee and Building Committee. Tenders are invited whenever is needed. Most of the classrooms are under CCTV surveillance. Some of them are well equipped with projectors and smart boards. The teachers use the ICT tools frequently in classroom transaction. There are one computer laboratory and one language laboratory in the college which are supervised by the respective faculty members. The computers are regularly checked by technician. There are volley ball courts and badminton courts for the students in order to maintain physical development of the students. There is also a Yoga centre in the college. There are separate common rooms and lavatories for girls and boys. The institution is trying to ensure proper maintenance and utilization of physical, academic and support facilities.

1. Income generation programme:

The institution organizes various self-financed programmes such as national and state-level seminars due to financial scarcity. The surplus income of these programmes is utilized to pay the remunerations of trainers of different skill-based add-on certificate courses. The Weaving and Training Cell of the college supplies materials and monetary assistance to the weavers of nearby villages for their self-employment. This activity not only benefits them but generates income for the institution.

2. Improving the teaching-learning process:

The teachers take special classes, tutorials, and special lecture programme for students to enhance their border knowledge. The drop-out rate of students is minimized, and the percentage of student attendance increased.
